- Got tv screens working later in the week. Was a challenge to get them going, but worked well.
- Many compliments about organization for the cattle barn and show, and horse barn and shows. Infield events were very well organized and ran very smooth. Radio traffic was minimal.
- Demolition derby had 104 cars.
- Attendance Friday was significantly lower. Tuesday attendance was down. No paid advertising for any events. No senior day. No Veterans day.
- Parking was better. Pumpkin Show committee was organized and efficient.
   Worked out really well.
- There were issues with people wanting to get in the gate for nothing. Everyone was "with the sled puller". Need to send a set # of wristbands/tickets ahead of the day they arrive.

- Need more entertainment during the day that will draw families to come to watch their loved ones perform (dancing, cheerleading, etc.). Need a jr. fair night.
- Happy with ride vendor. Layout needs changed. Cane game went well.
- Truck and Tractor pulls. We're paying \$366 per hook for tractors. 15 tractors.
   We need to negotiate contracts for cost savings. Do not sign a contract at convention.
- Sean was pleased and appreciative with Marsha Few helping with counting and balancing each night. Went smooth.
- Need to do a better, thorough post-fair clean up. Barns were not kept clean
  during fair week and were left a mess after. They need a deep cleaning.
  Committees need to improve on focusing on cleaning up their barn and around
  it. Post a cleaning schedule for 4-H clubs during fair week. Incentivize with a
  pizza night when they arrive to clean up.
