



PICKAWAY COUNTY FAIR CAMPING RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Camping is allowed only in approved camping spaces.
- Payment is required to be made in full prior to any camping on the fairgrounds.
- Camping is \$200 for the week for 30 amp or \$230 for 50 amp.
- **Each person camping will be required to purchase either an exhibitor pass or membership pass at the time of contract signing (minimum one/camper).**
- All applications for camping at the Pickaway County Fair ("PCF") will be reviewed by the camping committee and must be approved prior to acceptance for any space assignments.
- Camping sign-up can be done anytime during the year before camping is due in March.
- Camping space assignments will be made by the camping committee. Every effort is made to honor requests for specific locations; however, the camping committee has final decision.
- All campers must be backed into spots with tongues accessible (no "U" parking) and placed on the left side of the site. A camping committee member will be present when the camper is backed into a camping space. There must be fifteen (15) feet between campers per ORC3701-26-07 Sec A.
- Failure to comply with any terms of the contract and/or these rules and regulations will lead to future denial of camping privileges or removal of camping unit without a refund.
- Camper move-in begins Friday, June 15, 2018. All campers must be in place by midnight Sunday, June 17, 2018.
- A representative of the camping committee will inspect each camper hook-up. Electric and water will not be available until Friday, June 15, 2018 at 8am.
- Any campers moved in prior to June 15, 2017 will be charged \$25/day.
- Campers in spots 3-51 will be issued two (2) parking passes per camping space. The camping committee will resolve any disputes involving camping spaces or parking. Vehicles that are improperly parked will be towed at the owner's expense.
- No persons other than those listed on the contract will be permitted in the campgrounds areas. Each camping unit must have a responsible adult staying overnight, preferably a parent. This individual is responsible for all children and activities at the campsite. If there are problems with that specific unit, the responsible adult will be asked to resolve the problem. If no corrective action results to the satisfaction of the camping committee, the signee of the contract will be contacted and asked to remove the unit immediately without refund of camping fee(s).
- All units must be removed from the fair by Monday, June 25, 2018.
- ALL trash is to be placed in receptacles, NOT left at campsite. If there is excessive trash left in any camping spot, that camper will not be permitted to return the following year.
- Rules will be enforced by The Pickaway County Agricultural Society and The Pickaway County Sherriff's Department.
